

How to Use 'The Hub'

The Care Inspectorate's improvement website, The Hub launched in September 2013. Aimed at supporting improvement in the social care and social work sectors, the site's popularity continues to grow. In summer 2018, we began work to refresh The Hub and consulted our own staff, existing users of the site and key stakeholders from within the sector. It was clear that although users found the site extremely helpful in their day-to-day work, they wanted to quickly and easily find in one place all of the information and resources directly relevant to their service type.

We quickly got to work bringing together all that was good with the current Hub, while incorporating some new and exciting features and in March 2019 we launched the new Hub.

Accessible to all, The Hub is a central point of access to a wide range of features, including:

- improvement guidance, advice and resources
- information on national policy and legislation
- Care Inspectorate programmes and publications
- weekly news bulletins
- · events and training.


It is broken down into five key sections for you to navigate, namely:

- How We Support Improvement (An overview of all our improvement resources on the Hub as well as information on our recent improvement work).
- National Policy and Legislation (The information on policy developments, as well as relevant legislation and the Health and Social Care Standards).
- Resources (A library of resources including guidance, research and other publications, as well as bespoke resources relating to Early Learning and Childcare and Self-directed Support).
- **News** (Our weekly updates on key news, research and policy developments for either children and young people or adult social care and health).
- Events (Details of upcoming conferences, training, seminars and online courses relating to social care and social work in Scotland).

Health and Social Care Standards


You will find all information about the new Health and Social Care Standards published by the Scottish Government in this section.





How to search


You can find a search function at the top right hand corner of every page on The Hub. You simply click on a search function and the search bar will appear. From here, you can search the entire website for all the words you enter, or choose to search for a particular phrase (if you're looking for a specific publication and you know the title), or for any of the words you enter.




You can also filter publications in Resources by resource type, topics, I work with, care settings, date, view all and sort by latest to oldest or alphabetical order.

You simply go to Resources and use the clickable boxes to apply filters to narrow down your search.


You can use any or all of the search filters to narrow down your search for publications – use them together to search for publications on specific topics within a time period.




Click on Resource Type if you're looking for specific publications such as those published by the Care Inspectorate.



Click on Topics for a longer list of subject areas – you can narrow down your search to a specific area such as Food and Fluid.




Click on I work with if you are looking for a specific kind of publication related to children and young people or adults and older people.




Click on care settings to narrow down your search to a specific area such as Care Homes or Childminding.




Click on Date to filter publications by date range – you can use this alongside other search filters such as Care Settings or Topics to see if there have been any relevant publications in your subject area in a specific time period such as six months, or a year.



Click on View: all if you would like to see all resources on the Hub.



Click on Sort by to filter publications from latest to oldest or A-Z or Z-A.



My Library

It works like any other online account – you simply need to register with an email address and once you're logged in you can save documents to your own account. So every time you log back in, you can find the same documents saved in My Library. This means you don't have to save publications to your desktop or to a particular computer or device. As long as you have access to a computer or device, and the internet, you can access your library from wherever you are.

You can use this to save the most important documents for guidance that you need on a regular basis, save news bulletins to remind yourself to read them later, or create an induction pack for new colleagues with all the relevant documents for their care setting.

When you see the icon 'Save to My Library' that indicates that this information can be saved – just make sure you're logged into your account, click on the icon and it should save to your personal account.

You will also have the option of linking directly into SSKS's digital library with free access to a number of journals and books.
