Duty on care service providers to ensure appropriate staffing

Suitably qualified and competent individuals in such numbers for

- a) The health and wellbeing of people
 - b) Provision of safe high-quality care

Part 3, Section 7 (1)

And in so far as if affects either of those matters....

c) The wellbeing of staff







In determining appropriate numbers providers must have regard to:

- a) nature of the care service
 - b) size of the care service
 - c) aims and objectives
 - d) number of people who use the service
- e) needs of those people


Workers in a care service includes:

- Agency and other temporary / contract workers
- Self-employed workers
- Those on apprenticeship schemes and other 'earn as you learn' schemes who are employed by the care service
- All volunteers


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
